





Here is a teaching display you can make. Print pages 4 and 5, laminate, and cut. Glue all to a board. I put velcro on the carrots and on top of bunnies head. I add carrots while the students count. Then we say the poems, "4 carrots on top. Bunny will not let them drop." Lastly we put squares in our ten frame to match the carrots on bunnies head.










